- Young people own this project.

















#### Our Space



Our Space – an inclusive, safe (physical and mental), and welcoming space, open to all youth aged 8 - 25, from within the Greater Belfast area and beyond.

Co-designing a journey with young people that focuses on 4 key outcomes. Our Space participants will be able to:

- Self-reflect and critically analyse their identity and values
- Develop confidence in expressing ideas, thoughts and opinions
- Effectively listen to, and give space to others, creating safe spaces for others' ideas, thoughts and opinions
- Be empowered to exercise their autonomy and have belief in their own problem-solving and decisionmaking.

Developing our own participation model and methodology for community building and creating safe spaces.





## Programmes within Our Space



- Creative Youth: Multi-arts classes for children and young people aged 5-18.
- Youth Arts for Social Action: Multi-arts classes for youth aged 14-25.
- Outreach programme: outreach classes in schools, youth and community
- Future Leaders: Professional and personal development for 16-25 year olds through coaching and mentoring.
- Summer Scheme: annual summer project encourages young people to develop, design and implement a one-week event

## Learning

- Taking time to reflect: Use reflective ways of working collaboratively through co-design & participatory processes

Our Space has resulted in a range of benefits for diverse groups of young people:

- ✓ confidence
- ✓ personal development
- √ social skills
- ✓ self-awareness
- ✓ active citizenship

What is most valuable about the programme? – "being able to be fully yourself without judgement" (Young Person)

"This programme is absolutely amazing, it has definitely increased her confidence, has allowed her to make amazing new friends, and enjoy being creative and encouraging diversity. The staff are fabulous, they provide great opportunities for the kids and are so highly spoken of. Communication is great and it is definitely a great safe space for children" (Parent)

### Impact





#### Community outreach sessions

✓ reached individuals who might not otherwise have access to such opportunities

#### Sessions resulted in

- ✓ a sense of community and connectedness
- √ reduced feelings of isolation
- ✓ encouraged mutual support among participants.

"It gave our LGBTQIA+ group a chance to be creative and express themselves through art and share this comfortably in a group setting" (Youth Worker)

## Stories: Carnival School programme



- Young people learned to express themselves via a range of carnival arts mediums
- Carnival celebration within their school/youth group setting.
- Year 1: collaborated with 14 diverse schools, youth and community groups
- Hosted sessions with 3 different groups in the SEN department,
   Belfast Metropolitan College.
- Groups came together to create a 'Carnival in the Corridor', expressing and celebrating their individuality.
